

Undercover Author



Reviews For Sale—Are They Worth It?

If you're involved in the indie author community on Facebook at all, as an author, reader, blogger, editor, publisher, cover model or designer, it can be assumed, at some point, you've heard about the controversy over paid reviews. Run a search on 'paid book reviews' and hundreds of URLs pop up for you to choose from. As an author, I've even been private messaged on FB by unscrupulous people offering to review my books for a fee. Hell, they'll even let *me* write the reviews and they will post them on Amazon, Goodreads, and anywhere else I want them under one or more of their aliases. Five, ten, or twenty different reviews, if I'm willing to pony up more money. The cheapest offers I can recall seeing were \$5 for postings on three to five sites. The most expensive ones were in the \$500 range, which I'm still in sticker shock over—not that I used any of these services.

Now, as immoral as this sounds, these shysters wouldn't be peddling their services if people weren't taken them up on their offers. So, what does that say about the authors themselves? The ones who stooped to that low level, just above pond scum, where these rats can be found. It says one of the following:


- A They don't have enough confidence in themselves or their talent to seek out real, honest reviews;
- B They don't know where to find or are too lazy to seek out those honest reviewers
- C Their book is so poorly written, that instead of taking poor reviews and using them as a guide to fix the problem, they refuse to admit that they are the problem to begin with. They'll rip the reviewers apart, claiming they are ignorant people who couldn't review their way out of a paper bag!

Out of the three choices above, I highly recommend authors avoid #3 as several in the past learned the hard way not to respond negatively, or at all, to poor reviews. The few I happened to witness doing this will never be able to publish anything under the name they were using ever again without being a continued laughing stock of the literary and social media world.





Meet Marc Remus

Children's Author & Illustrator

What were your first thoughts when told that you should write books?

Looking back to the years before college, I probably would have considered everyone crazy who had told me that I would write books one day.

As a teenager I was not very skilled with words and focused mainly on painting.

It was not until college that I began to illustrate picture books. My instructor motivated me to write my own stories and from that day on I began to improve my skills and learn how to write books.

Can you share with us readers what your inspiration was when creating your debut novel, The Gallery of Wonders?

I have studied illustrations at Art Center College of Design in Pasadena, California. There I learned everything about painting. When I got into illustrating picture books, I began to wonder what it would be like to enter my paintings physically. And so I came up with the idea of a magic brush that could open a painting and let you experience everything that is inside of it.

I created a picture book story called Painting Brian which was the foundation of the Magora series. Brian Findley was the main character of the story but over time he became a secondary character and gave way to Holly O'Flanigan, the leading character.

Which of your characters did you create first, when writing your children's book?

The main character is usually the one you start with. If the main character does not grab the reader, you can forget about the entire book. So it is important to

know what your main character's goals, wishes, hopes, dreams and fears are, before you can start writing.

Unfortunately, I didn't know much about writing when I started the Magora series. I didn't have a clear vision of the main characters at first. I wished I had known what I know now. I could have saved myself at least five years of rewriting the first book. Even though the first character I created was Brian Findley, he was not the one I should have started with. Today I would create Holly first, and then move on to the sidekicks.

How does it feel to be able to both illustrate and write your own books?

It is a blessing to be able to do both. Illustrating helps me with my writing and vice versa. The scenes I create are like movie sequences in my head. I can see the scene and just have to describe what I see. So the visuals make the writing easier. And once I have the writing down, I can always go back, pick a scene, and create an illustration from it.

Being an illustrator allowed me to create the world of Magora completely on my own without having to make sacrifices. I created the covers, the logo, the website at www.Magora.net, the layout of the paperback and the graphics. Being able to do all this on my own, feels very good.

Can you share with us readers what it is like being an illustrator?

Being an illustrator can be a joy and a nightmare at the same time. You spend a lot of time on your own. This allows you to focus on your work, and it reduces stress with other people. But it can also isolate you. I met a lot of visual artists who have communication problems due to their work. If you focus on visuals all the time you forget how to communicate with people. Therefore I studied acting as well so that I have a balance and won't lose my communication skills.

You have mentioned that there are more books in your children's book series. What is the next book called and can you briefly share with us what it's about?

There are six books in the series, all of which are completed. The third book, which I plan to release in September, is called The Bridge in the Fog.

I don't want to give away too much yet, but you will find out much more about the dangerous Unfinished, creatures that have not been completed by their master painter. The issue of the doubles will also be addressed in more detail and Holly will go on a journey to find the mysterious Bridge in the Fog that has been hidden for centuries.

The entire series has an overall story which will take a twist in the sixth book. Along the way new secrets will be resolved and things that didn't seem to make sense in the first books become clearer as the series continues.

If you had to choose which character of yours, which one would you say is your favorite?

Do you mean which character of mine is my favorite?

Of course, it would be Holly. I think every author loves his/her main character best. I wouldn't have picked Holly as a main character, if I didn't favor her. Even though she is filled with

self-doubt at the beginning of the series, it was enjoyable to give her, over time, the confidence she deserved.

But I have to say that I also enjoyed Amanda a lot. She turns from an arrogant and obnoxious beauty queen to a likeable character. It was exciting to make the reader hate Amanda at first until she changes and becomes a friend.

Let's say, *The Gallery of Wonders* turns into a TV program series or a movie series for children. Which actors would you have playing the parts for Holly, Holly's Grandpa, and the Professor?

That is a very good question and I could have answered that right away twenty years ago.

When I started writing Magora I based the character of Holly on my cousin, who was born at the time. Sophia had the curls and the round face that I imagined Holly to have. But since then Sophia has grown into a beautiful woman in her 20s, who can't play the role of a child anymore. Therefore, for Holly I can't think of anybody who could fill that role.

It's a different story with certain professors. One of the profes-

sors, Gobeli, is based on a friend of mine who has been an actress in Florida for a long time. So I would want to see her in the role that I wrote for her.

Ms. Hubbleworth is a crazy character with a lot of charisma, and her role would be hard to fill. Being a big fan of Meryl Streep though, I believe that she could portrait that character perfectly.

The headmistress of Cliffony, Professor LePawnee, is a special character. Elegance, authority, and finesse are her characteristics. She belongs to a species called Ledesmas and is Asian looking. Therefore, I always thought of Lucy Liu when writing about Professor LePawnee. Of course, Lucy Lui would have to walk on stilts to measure up to the tall professor.

Last but not least there is Cookie. I believe there couldn't be a better choice than myself for this role. I studied acting for many years and have put so much of myself into this character that I would love to become this big, fat troll.

What advice would you give to other writers?

Be open to critiques by professionals and don't rush it! I see so many authors fail because they don't take any advice from people who are experts in their field. Writing is a learning process. Nobody knows everything and nobody is perfect from the start

from the start.

It took me seven years and hundreds of revisions to get the The Gallery of Wonders ready for publication and another thirteen years to finish the remaining five books in the series. You can't expect to get a book written, edited, and published within a year if you haven't written a book before. So be patient and focus on

the writing rather than the publication.

The first two books of the series are coming out on Amazon the beginning of February. Book 3 is scheduled for September. In April the books should become available in regular bookstores but they probably won't stock them. So it is always easier to get them on Amazon. I am always keeping readers updated about releases and publications on my Twitter (MarcRemusArt) and Facebook (Magorabook) accounts.



Secrets of Writers

We all want to know an author's great sauce for the perfect book recipe. But not every recipe is to every writer's taste. So, then we are left with nothing. One recipe worked for one writer yet it didn't work for me.

If we all take a moment to sit, look around us, and think for a moment...all is not lost.

Need a genre niche to write in? Take a look at Amazon at any genre that you have a feel for. Once there, look and see what sells the best. One that sells the most books is the niche to write in; however, it is also, an excellent idea to see what niche of writing isn't covered by today's market. Now, that's a secret worth exploring into. No, has written something in a particular niche and once you find out what that is, you can go ahead and plan your next steps to writing and selling that book or books.

Have trouble with coming up with the best title? A title is one part in grabbing audiences from all over. Again, go onto Amazon and Goodreads. Look at names of books that have been or will be published. Sometimes these sprout an idea that can be turned not only into a title but into a story as well.

You just wrote your first book. Now you need to know if it's worth publishing or needs major rewriting. Well, the best ways to accomplish this goal is to set out asking others to read your work. Look for sites that have beta readers and book reviewers. These sites will give you a good heads up on how well your book has been written and where it sits with readers. If you feel confident enough to publish after receiving the feedback and it's been through the editing process as well, then go ahead and publish it.

Smart Marketing

Let's say our writing has been through editing process. What next? First, if you haven't already you need to set up an author website, social media accounts, and learn how to use the internet in a way that makes you feel comfortable.

Author websites are free and easy to create. These are highly recommended for any writer wanting to publish and get their name out there. You can use Facebook, WordPress, Google Sites, and many others to create your author page. Most of these sites have it to where you just fill in the info and they design the site for you.

Next, social media is the number one way to spread word about your writing, new releases, and etc. You need to have Tumblr, Twitter, and Facebook. These must be updated daily until you have built up an audience that reaches over the 1,000 mile marker. Trust me this won't be easy, but it's a must do. You should make sure to use photos, hashtags, and great titles/ lines to nab those readers so that you convince them to follow you regularly.

Also, look for blogs that feature free book reviews, and author interviews, spotlights, and giveaways. These all are excellent marketing strategies every writer needs to know.

Struggles New Authors Face

All writers face struggles but not like this...it has recently been a major issue that readers who follow their authors on Amazon run the risk of not having their reviews posted.

Can you imagine releasing your book(s) and have readers who posted their review only to have it taken down simply for following you on Amazon?

How do we avoid this issue? What can we do? No worries. Most authors have newsletters on their author websites that allow readers to get the latest updates on what their authors are doing.

Plus, many authors including bestselling authors have gone back to Facebook and set up pages strictly for their readers to follow them.

This way their readers can a) still post their reviews up on Amazon and b) still follow their authors.

Finding Your Confidence as a Writer

One way for writers to grow their confidence is to take online course s and or conferences in writing. These are perfect for brushing up one's writing skills and help build up connections with other writers.

Many of these courses can also, help writers improve their writing to a point where they can edit their own manuscripts without paying an editor a hefty price. Now, that's a plus to any writer's confidence. They better your writing becomes the stronger your confidence and writing grows.

So next time you see classes, webinars, or conferences near you, check them out and sign up!
